## Report from the Session

Session met May 9, in the library. The elders dwelled in the Word, Acts 2:1-13. We received the treasurer and memorial fund reports. The session voted to create a Technology team lead Joe Bonsted. The purchase of additional sensors for the security system was approved and the technology team will be looking into the possible consolidation of the citadel, fire, and security systems into one. The elders received the report from the education team that Pastor Heidi will be working to relaunch the Bethesda Youth Group this year. VBS flyers are going out to the neighborhood and apartment complexes near the church. If anyone is interested in helping, see Ken Alexy. There will be a bible study in the fall during the evening at the church. The elders approved the request of City Church to hold car washes in the parking lot on several Saturdays throughout the summer to support their youth group missions project for a small fee. The elders received the report of the property team that 4 companies including our lawn service do not do weeding. We will be contacting some other service companies in the area and the apartment complex management for other pricing to maintain the gardens. AKRF will be filming a short video about our rain gardens and Jim Baney will be bringing a crew out to spruce up the gardens in the beginning of June prior to the video. The elders approved and

empowered each department to organize and clean out their areas – education, music, women's ministry and office staff. A team has been assembled to begin organizing and prepping historical documents to be transported to the Presbyterian Archives in Philadelphia. Pastor Heidi's installation service will be June 11<sup>th</sup> at 4pm. After sharing joys and concerns, we prayed. We adjourned to the June 13 meeting.

## Report from the Deacons

Deacon's meeting was held on Wednesday, May 10, 2017. We were very happy to welcome Pastor Heidi who joined us at the meeting. At our April meeting there was an issue that the terms of some of the Deacon's was wrong. Their terms have now been corrected. Ken informed us that the dripless candles were costing \$39 each for a total of \$2,758.08. The cost was approved and will come out of the Memorial Fund. On Mother's Day the Offering will be taken by the men since the women will be singing at that time. Pastor Heidi will continue with the breaking of the loaf of bread during the Communion service. Pastor Heidi informed us that on May 14<sup>th</sup> there will be a special prayer given for Jillian Massey whose brain cancer has returned. Joan Case will send appropriate greeting cards to members to let them know we are thinking of them. Georgia Hopely offered to bring Jeanne Scott to church on Sundays.

Carol Caputo mentioned that Debbie Thomas offered to supply pens for the attendance books in each pew. Joan Case offered to purchase a few candle lighters since some were missing. Our next meeting is on Wednesday, June 14<sup>th</sup> at 7pm.
